As this is a normal school day, the usual rules regarding mobile phones will apply.

#### Concussion

Sport provides many physical, psychological and emotional benefits for students. It is crucial that sport remains a safe place for young people.

Concussion is a brain injury caused by a knock to the head, a fall or any blow to the body that is transmitted to the head. All concussion is serious.

Recently the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS) released 'Australian Concussion Guidelines for Youth and Community Sport'. The guidelines provide information on how to recognise and manage concussion from the time of injury through to safe return to school and playing sport. The Department already has in place Concussion protocols developed in conjunction with The Children's Hospital; they will be reviewed in line with the AIS document.

It is important that parents advise the school if your child has had a head knock or concussion outside school, for example at weekend sport or an accident. Remember:

## **Some Interesting Research**

Researchers at the University of Sydney, led by Dr Katherine Owen, analysed the sports participation and academic performance of over 4,200 students. The researcher found participation in sport was linked to higher NAPLAN scores, school attendance and higher likelihood of university admission.

Individual sports, for example dance, tennis or swimming, were more closely related with higher literacy NAPLAN scores. Participation in any type of sport was associated with higher numeracy scores. Only participation in team sports was linked to lower absenteeism without permission. It is thought that team sports foster more social connection which results in higher attendance.

There was an increase in academic outcomes while a student continued playing sport. Continuing sport throughout schooling can help students keep focused and provide respite from study and reduce anxiety and stress.

A 2017 Australian Sports Commission (ASC) report identified several barriers to secondary students playing sport. All of the research the ASC has done showed that students drop out because it gets too competitive. Sporting bodies need to do more to provide more social games.

## MOBILE PHONES AND PERSONAL DEVICES POLICY

From the beginning of Term 4, 2023 the NSW Government implemented state-wide restrictions on the use of mobile phones in NSW high schools. This strategy is to increase focus and learning in classrooms, remove distractions and also promote positive social interactions.

Heathcote High School had already implemented a policy where students are required to lock away their phones in a pouch when they enter the school gates. Students are not allowed to use their mobile phones at school, including during recess, breaks and lunch. Students will be able to carry their phones while travelling to and from school. Exemptions can be applied for if a student needs their phone for a medical, wellbeing or learning need. Exemptions will be granted on a case by case basis.

Smart watches must be in 'aeroplane mode' and headphones or earbuds cannot be used during the school day. Cash or card is required at the school canteen.

BYOD or school-issued laptops are NOT part of the ban. However, these devices cannot be accessed before classes or during breaks on school grounds. Teachers may also request or allow students to use listening accessories with their laptops as required for class learning activities.

Students must take full responsibility for any mobile phone or personal device brought to school. The school or staff will not be responsible for their loss, theft, or damage. Students, who bring their devices to school, do so at their own risk.

The mobile phone management strategy applies to school excursions, unless an exemption is made by the principal. If that is the case, information will be included in the excursion permission form.

If students have their phones or personal digital device out, they will immediately be instructed to deliver it to the Deputy Principal. Failure to follow the discipline code will incur more severe consequences.

Parents and carers are respectfully requested not to text or phone their child during the school day. If you need to contact your child in an emergency, please call the school office on 9520 9488. Students will also be able to contact parents or carers through the school office, if urgent.
