Students are required to read 20 books, up to 10 of which may be personal choice books that are not on the PRC book list. The many benefits of reading include: improves language skills, increases vocabulary, expands knowledge, cultivates imagination and creativity, and inspires a life-long love of learning.

#### **UOW DISCOVERY DAY**

Year 12 students attended a University of Wollongong Discovery Day on Monday 12 February to experience university life. Students built their own timetable based on their interests and got valuable insights on courses and resources available.

#### **NEW SPORTING HOUSE DESIGNS**

We are proud to present our new sporting house designs for Heathcote High School.



The redesign was a student-led initiative which began at the end of 2022 when students participating in the Interdisciplinary Project (IDP) came up with the idea to include our Dharawal heritage into our sporting houses. From there we have worked closely with the Aboriginal community to realise the students' idea.

Our students, both Aboriginal and non-indigenous participated in a variety of workshops with community members to select the totems and design new logos that are unique to our school and the Country we are on. Miss Webster developed these designs into the final designs, shown above.

While still keeping the original school's history of the four flowers – Bluebell, Banksia, Wattle and Waratah, we have incorporated animal totems in Dharawal language.

Bluebell has a totem of Bumbayan (bowerbird)

Banksia has a totem of Djarungali (green tree frog)

Wattle has a totem of Yumbayumba (white cockatoo)

Waratah has a totem of Mundha (black snake)

A special thank you to members of the local Aboriginal community who have helped guide our school in the process including Graeme Avery, Karen Armstrong, Bree Knapp, Aunty Calita, and our Aboriginal Education Officer, Amy Cousins.

#### Year 9 Geography

Year 9 Geography students have enjoyed their study of Sustainable Biomes. The students have been tasked to investigate the importance of each biome and how human activity can impact on them. They used their collaboration, creativity, communication, and critical thinking skills to collate and present their ideas.

# YEARS 11 & 12 VISUAL ARTS EXCURSION TO THE NSW ART GALLERY

On Friday 1 March, Years 11 and 12 visited the Art Gallery of NSW to see ARTEXPRESS an exhibition of outstanding student artworks developed for the 2023 HSC Visual Arts course.

The students were inspired by the range of works including painting, photo-media,

drawing, textiles, ceramics and by the stories outlining the stimulus behind the works and the influencing artists.



As an added treat the students also saw the exhibition of French-American artist Louise Bourgeois (1911-2010).

The exhibition 'Has the Day Invaded the Night or Has the Night Invaded the Day?' is in the North Building (new) of the Art Gallery of NSW. Day is on Level 2 and Night is downstairs in the Tank. Outside the South Building (original) is the sculpture 'Maman'. It is made of bronze, steel and marble and stands 9m high and 10m wide.

The exhibition is one of the most extensive ever dedicated to an international woman artist in Australia – quite fitting as we celebrate International Women's Day on March 8.
